The 10th KOCSEA Technical Symposium

The KOCSEA Technical Symposium 2009 was held at University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV) on December 18th -19th, 2009.

The two day event included four keynote speeches by Prof. Chan-Mo Park (President of the National Research Foundation of Korea), Prof. Kang G. Shin (University of Michigan), Prof. Myungjong Lee (City University of New York), and Dr. Jaehoon Kim (KSEA), six technical sessions, and an award ceremony. About fifty researchers, from the academia, the industry, and the US Government, participated in the event, including seven non-Korean speakers. In addition to the research talks, the program included a special panel session on “26 years of KOCSEA and beyond” sharing the past, present, and future of KOCSEA with participants.

The event was co-organized by KOCSEA, KUSCO (Korea US Science Cooperation Center, Inc.), and KSEA (Korean Scientists and Engineers Association) with generous support from KUSCO, KSEA, Telcordia Technologies, Samsung, and ETRI (Electronics and Telecommunications Research Institute).
